Hands on Science

This two week experience will be divided into two of the major science groups—Physics and Chemistry. Each day will be filled with a combination of science demonstrations and hands-on activities that introduce foundational concepts within in each field of science. Week one will focus on Physics principles and week two will focus on Chemistry Principles.


Journey with Lewis and Clark

Instructor: Mr. Lamb



HIGH SCHOOL PREP PROGRAM

For students registered for Fall enrollment as 9th graders at La Salle

Cost: \$100 per Math and English course (plus a \$15 registration fee)

ALGEBRA PREP

Instructor: Mr. Forsyth

This course is offered to incoming 9th graders who meet one of the following criteria: students with low math entrance exam scores who need to review in order to succeed in Algebra I, or students who would like to enhance their Algebra skills in order to become more successful in Algebra I. The material covered in this class will be math topics spanning from Pre-Algebra to basic Algebra skills.

ENGLISH PREP

Instructor: Mrs. Ball

This course is designed to allow incoming freshmen an opportunity to explore the world of literature that they will discover in their high school years. It introduces them to the high school English environment, including lecture, large and small group discussions of short stories, poems, non-fiction and the study of the novel. Skills in note taking, organizing a note book, reading comprehension, and vocabulary development are included. This course is also de-

Camp College is a four day seminar for incoming seniors. Students will be given the necessary tools to continue their college search and essay writing throughout the summer. They will become familiar with computer and internet tools available to them. They will receive individualized help as they create an organizational system for the college search and application process, complete a practice common application, write a first draft of the personal statement (college essay) and develop an individualized college comparison chart and calendar that will help them meet deadlines. Discussion topics include college visits, interviews, recommendations, FAFSA, financial aid and scholarships.
